

RENOVATION + EXPANSION (TARGETING LEED SILVER) ARKANSAS MUSEUM OF FINE ARTS LITTLE ROCK, AR

The Arkansas Museum of Fine Arts is Little Rock's premier cultural institution, comprised of both an art museum and a center for the visual and performing arts. It's located in downtown Little Rock in the heart of the historic MacArthur Park. In addition to its art collections, the museum supports a highly-regarded Children's Theater and Museum Art School. Its vision is to be a cultural beacon and a catalyst for advancing arts education, enhancing the quality of life, and promoting civic and cultural development in the community.

In 2013, research confirmed that the condition of the facility was an obstacle to continued accreditation, future growth, and its mission to be a vital part of the fabric of the city. Further study determined that renovation and expansion was the best course of action. The Arkansas Museum of Fine Arts selected Studio Gang as the design architect and architect of record, supported by Polk Stanley Wilcox as associate architects, to design the project.

The new design creates vibrant spaces for interaction; improves wayfinding for visitors, reconnects the museum more dynamically to the park; creates more fluid connections between key programs (its collections, the Museum School, and its Children's Theater); reduces operational inefficiencies; and replaces critically outdated maintenance systems. The project creates 127,000 sf of new and renovated spaces for the facility.

MODERN WING PROGRAM (LEED SILVER) ART INSTITUTE OF CHICAGO CHICAGO, IL

Located in Millennium Park in downtown Chicago, the Art Institute of Chicago's Renzo-Piano designed Modern Wing Program involved a 260,000 sf addition; an enabling upgrade to the entire campus mechanical, electrical and plumbing central plant; the Nichols Bridgeway, which was a significant increase to the projects initial scope, was a 650-foot-long bridge that connects the Modern Wing's third floor to Millennium Park; renovations to Gunsaulus Hall, adjacent to the new wing; relocation of staff and operations in the way of construction; and relocation of IT backbone.

The Modern Wing is dedicated to the Art Institute of Chicago's modern and contemporary collections, housing galleries, an education center including classrooms and studios, and a restaurant. The Modern Wing is a model of sustainability, incorporating state of-the-art technology – most notably, the carefully engineered whole-roof shading device with site specific computer-modeled blades oriented to filter daylight into upper level galleries.

The Modern Wing had a very successful private fundraising campaign which inspired the Trustees to add significant scope to the project late in the design and construction process. Our team developed customized processes and controls to integrate this new scope into the project schedule and quantify the cost impacts.



HISTORIC RENOVATION + EXPANSION (LEED GOLD) HARVARD ART MUSEUMS CAMBRIDGE, MA

This renovation consolidated Harvard's three museums (the Fogg, the Busch-Reisinger, and the Arthur M. Sackler) and 4 research centers (Straus Center for Conservation, Center for the Technical Study of Modern Art, Archaeological Exploration of Sardis, and Harvard University Art Museums Archives) into a single, state-of-the-art facility. Together these components constitute a unique institution dedicated to acquisition, preservation, research, interpretation, and education.

Anser leadership managed all aspects of the Harvard Art Museums project, as well as enabling projects. The new facility, designed by Renzo Piano Building Workshop, included 104,000 square feet of renovation to the existing Fogg Museum building and 100,000 square feet of new construction. The building's existing exterior and current central courtyard were maintained, all mechanical systems were upgraded, and the existing Busch-Reisinger building was torn down. The expansion also included a 150-seat auditorium with a projection room and a smaller 100-seat lecture space. Exhibition space also increased and a dedicated study center was created.

The museums' challenge was to manage the size of the collection, its diversity in display and organizing within the site constraints. Meeting the museum needs given a constrained site within an urban environment, historic sensitivity was one of the many projects' accomplishments.

CONSERVATION CENTER RENOVATION MUSEUM OF FINE ARTS, BOSTON BOSTON, MA

The Conservation Center Renovation at the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston is a series of new lab spaces that expands the museum's ability to care for its vast collections. Anser provided design and construction management services from concept design through commissioning and project closeout. Anser's work allowed the museum in continuing its normal day-to-day operations while relieving the burden of managing the project's design team and contractor.

The new conservation lab augments the museum's capacity to study, care for, and curate its collection with state-of-the-art technology and facilities. The third floor of the existing White Wing was renovated to house furniture and frames conservation, mount making, and scientific research. The fourth floor was renovated for painting and objects conservation. An entirely new, efficient climate control system along with a new roof, skylight monitors, solvent exhausts, X-ray room and scientific research equipment enhance and expand the conservators' capabilities and efficiency. Additionally, dedicated learning spaces and interpretive displays allow the public to engage with conservators through demonstrations and workshops.

NEW CAMPUS (TARGETING LEED V4 PLATINUM) OBAMA PRESIDENTIAL CENTER CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

RENOVATION + EXPANSION PEABODY ESSEX MUSEUM SALEM, MA

Founded in 1799, the Peabody Essex Museum (PEM) is the nation's oldest continuously operating museum. Located in Salem, Massachusetts, the museum's collections encompass more than 1 million works of cultural and artistic significance that span more than 12,000 years of human creativity worldwide.

After assessing how it could more fully exhibit and utilize its vast collection and facilities, PEM identified the need for additional exhibition space. The museum's facility expansion project included gallery expansion and renovation. The project added 40,000 sf to the existing main building. The expansion added 15,000 sf of permanent gallery space to the museum and renovated 13,000 sf of existing gallery space.

Anser's role as the owner's project manager, was to lead the architect selection process and develop the overall program budget at the commencement of the Feasibility Study phase. The overall program development included off site collections storage and associated renovations to the Phillips Library. Anser provided construction management and oversight of the development of design documentation, contractor selection and contracting strategy development. Coordination with the museum's exhibit design department was also required to ensure that gallery expansion provided the types of gallery spaces suited for the collections.

EXPANSION PROGRAM (LEED GOLD) STERLING & FRANCINE CLARK ART INSTITUTE WILLIAMSTOWN, MA

This multi-phased Expansion Program aimed to re-orient and expand the visitor experience on the Clark's 140-acre campus. Anser established protocols for early identification of issues, orchestrated workshops and additional field visits to ensure fluid communications among all parties, and resolved problems without affecting critical path activities. The project involved phased renovations so that the staff could remain in the building while it was under construction.

Phase I included two major enabling projects. First was the construction of the 24,000 sf Stone Hill Center on the upper campus to allow for relocation of the Williamstown Art & Conservation Center out of the way of construction on the lower campus. Second was the replacement and demolition of the existing mechanical plant with a new 23,000 sf underground physical plant that also housed art transit, storage space, a wood shop, kitchen, and the primary loading dock area for shipping/ receiving.

Phase II involved the construction of the new 44,000 sf visitor, exhibition, conference center with special exhibition galleries, retail, café, conference facilities, a research center, and a large reflective pool; this project required coordination of construction activities adjacent to and above the newly occupied plant building.

Phase III completed the master plan and encompassed renovations to the historic 1955 Museum Building and the 1973 Manton Research Center.
